## Classroom News

Language Arts- We are continuing to work on our Resilience Cafe. We are going to start working on the poem to show how someone we know demonstrates resilience. We have started learning about the Holocaust. We have also started reading "Night" by Elie Wiesel.

Geometry - Triangles are complex. We are learning new triangle theorems to help us solve problems. Can any three lengths form a triangle? We used spaghetti noodles to prove that triangles must be created using a specific relationship between side lengths. Our next unit of study is Trigonometry!

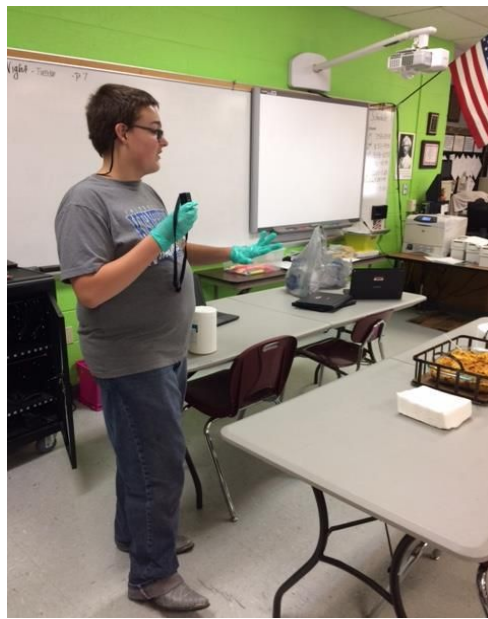
**Math**- We are creating scatterplots. We are drawing scatterplot trend lines in the classroom to create an equation and make predictions. Additionally, we will be learning new ways to solve equations.

**Science**- In science we are learning about eco-friendly construction techniques in our eco-houses and learning how to construct them. We are learning ways to conserve energy in our current and future homes. Throughout the month, we will create an eco-friendly home and informative presentation to present at our "home expo."

**Social Studies** - We have been researching about the Intolerable Acts. We are discussing the importance of each. We are also going to be making either a slideshow or a powtoon over the intolerable acts. It is our choice. Our next project is going to be researching and creating a project about the Revolutionary War.

**212** - We are working on a project called Life in 2027 . This project is about how you want your life to be in 2027. We are determining our career path, researching universities, trade schools or other post-secondary choices. Additionally, we are creating a budget based on our projected career salary. We will complete the project on November 3rd. Additionally, carpentry students are building a shed. Our aquaponic team is constantly monitoring the fish tank and water parameters. Garden beds and the greenhouse are maintained throughout the week. The recycling team is collecting recycling materials from all bins in each classroom. They bag and recycle all items.
